Armistice Day 11 November Lest we forget The Peace Garden Story



After war was declared in 1914 and the call to arms reached Lawrence, our valiant men took their places along with hosts of others in the forefront of the line that moved forward in defence of the traditional honour, righteousness and liberty. Suffice it to say that the men of Lawrence and surrounding districts,- some whose whole lives were woven into the very fibre and texture of our existence - others less intimately associated with the family life and environment of the town - played their part nobly and well. Inspired by the exalted sense of patriotism, scorning the yoke of a foreign despotism and consumed with the conviction that the salvation of the world was dependent on the success of the British and allied arms, they, in the splendour of their power and pride of youth, went forth to do, and, if need be, to die. It has been truly said that wars are won by those who give their lives in battle.

The measure of the heroism of the gallant men, whose names are associated either intimately or remotely with Lawrence is attested by the names of the illustrious dead - the non-returning brave-that appear on the Cenotaph. Their graves are far away in foreign lands. Gallipoli and Palestine, with Passchendale and other places in France, are the last resting places of the greater number of our men who fell. Though "crowned with the wreath that never perisheth- the diadem of honourable death" it was felt that some fitting memorial might be created as a tribute of regard for, and of honour to the memory of the gallant dead who had made such mighty sacrifice. To one inspired by deep regard for the nobility and heroism of such sacrifice came the beautiful thought of the creation of a Peace Garden.

The thought was translated into action and the outcome of that happily conceived idea is the existence of the beautiful laid out garden. The land (formerly occupied by the Commercial Hotel and stables) was bought by the McKinlay Family, cleared and laid out in garden. The garden was then presented to the Lawrence Borough Council and the citizens of Lawrence by Mrs A McKinlay. The idea is that it shall mark the establishment of Peace after the Great War and, further, that it shall be a memorial for all time to the undying fame and honour of the illustrious dead. The Cenotaph was built with money raised by public subscription. It was designed by Dunedin architect Leslie Coombs and Mr A Tilleyshort was engaged to carry out the building work. The completed memorial was unveiled on 27th May, 1925 by Mrs Samuel French. Interestingly it shows the war years as 1914-1919. This was because the Lawrence Borough Council did not receive any official notification of peace until 1919 and therefore maintained the war did not officially end in Lawrence until 1919.

The Garden was originally planted with trees and shrubs, mostly deciduous but comprising some of the native varieties, each tree and shrub being in memory of some brave soul who died in defence of right and liberty. In most cases the tree has been planted by the loving hands of relatives or friends of the departed. Records show 98 trees being planted to commemorate 104 fallen soldiers.

So long as the tree lives it will become an increasingly interesting monument to the memory of the individual soldier in whose honour it has been planted, and even if, in the fullness of time, any single tree should fade and pass away, the Garden, as a whole, will remain a living garden of hallowed memories, a testimony and a tribute to the valour of men who in the hey-dey of their youth "gave up the years to be their all – their immortality"

Looking far into the future the imagination pictures the Peace Garden as the haunt of the meditative man who in his effort to reach a solution of the Divine scheme of life dwells not only on the then immediate present, but while gazing through a short avenue of trees, allows his mind to wander back through the long vista of years that will have passed away until he finds himself in solemn contemplation of the circumstances that called for the creation of such a haven of peace and content.

The Lawrence Tuapeka Community Board is dedicated to preserving and maintaining the Peace Garden for our community.
